RedRover Safe Housing grants

Safe Housing On-site grants enable domestic violence shelters to create space for pets to live on-site with their owners.

Safe Housing Off-site grants help domestic violence shelters to partner with another local organization, such as an animal shelter or rescue sanctuary, to build housing at their facility specifically for animals whose owners are staying at the domestic violence shelter.

Safe Housing Startup grants allow domestic violence shelters to create their own program to help victims of domestic violence and their pets. For example, the domestic violence shelter could have ongoing boarding arrangements with a pet boarding facility or veterinarian.

RedRover Safe Housing grants are awarded for up to \$20,000 and are offered throughout the U.S.

- Applicants must be recognized by the IRS as 501(c)(3) organizations.
- Applicants must be agencies with a primary mission of sheltering victims of domestic violence.

Applications are due on May 15 and October 15.
